weak in health do hereby make this
my last will and testament to wit:

Recorded
Surremeen

That after my just debts have
all been paid I will devise and
bequeath to my beloved brother Henry
Surremeen Klinglesmith my entire
one half of two hundred and thirteen
acres of land lying in Dallas
County Texas with all of my real
estate wherever situated or located
and also all my personal property
wherever situated or located,

In testimony whereof I
hereunto set my hand and seal
this November the 5th 1875.

At a County Court began
and held for Hardin County at the
Court House in Elizabethtown on
Monday Decr 20th 1875 the foregoing
instrument of writing purporting to
be the true last will and testament

of George S Klinglesmith deceased was produced to Court and proven in due form of law by the oaths of Joel A Morrison and Saml Glasscock the two subscribing witnesses thereto and as such the same was established and ordered to be recorded,
