In the matter of the estate of Arthur M. Peck, deceased. In the County Court of Dallas County, sitting in probate matters.

To The Honorable Judge of said Court:

Comes now William H. Atwell, hereofore on the _____ day of _____ A. D. 1904, appointed temporary administrator of the estate of Arthur M. Peck, deceased, and shows to Your Honor that he was so appointed for the purpose of collecting certain deposits that were then and there due and owing to the said Arthur M. Peck by two certain banking institutions in the City of San Francisco, State of California.

That the said deposits and debts amounted in the aggregate to Eleven Hundred Sixteen and 61/100 (\$1116.61) Dollars.

That your temporary administrator collected the said debts and deposits in full, to-wit:- the sum of \$1116.61, from the following institutions, to-wit:- \$243.42 from the German Savings and Loan Society; \$873.19 from the Hibernia Savings and Loan Society, amounting as aforesaid, in the aggregate to \$1116.61.

That your temporary administrator thereafter, to-wit:- on September 6th 1904, delivered and paid the said sum of money to M. K. Peck and A. E. Peck the only heirs, survivors and legatees of the said Arthur M. Peck, deceased, which payment and delivery your temporary administrator shows, is evidenced by the receipt of the said M. K. and A. E. Peck which is hereto annexed and made a part hereof, and which receipt reads as follows, to-wit:-

"Dallas, Sept 6th 1904.
\$1116.61 Rec'd of W. H. Atwell, Administrator of the estate of Arthur M. Peck, dec'd., the sum of eleven hundred and sixteen & 61/100 in full settlement, payment & satisfaction of all sums due & belonging to us as the sole heirs of said deceased."

Wherefore, said Atwell shows that the time for which he was appointed as temporary administrator, and the purposes for which he was appointed as temporary administrator has elapsed and been fulfilled, and all of his duties and obligations

thereunder have been properly discharged; that the above sums of money and debts were the only moneys or properties or debts handled by him belonging to the said estate, and the same has been paid out as heretofore stated to the said heirs and legatees.

Wherefore, an order is prayed in terms of law, discharging this temporary administrator and approving the matters and acts done and evidenced by the allegations and exhibits herewith made and filed, all of which was in line with the orders and powers entered and granted by the court herein.

Come now M. K. Peck
and A. E. Peck, resident citizens of Dallas County, Texas, show
to Your Honor that they are the sole surviving heirs at law
and next of kin of Arthur M. Peck, deceased; that the said Ar-
thur M. Peck died in the state of California in the month of
June, A.D. 1904, intestate; that he left ^{or specific bequest,} debts, and so far
as these petitioners are advised, had no creditors save and
except as hereinafter stated.

Your applicants show that at the time of the decease of
the said Arthur M. Peck the Hibernia Savings & Loan Society of
San Francisco, California, was indebted to said Arthur M.
Peck, and is now indebted to said Peck in the sum of about
Eight Hundred Sixty and 46/100 (\$860.46) Dollars; that at the
time of the decease of the said Peck, and now the Germania
Savings & Loan Society of San Francisco, California, is in-
debted to the said Arthur M. Peck in the sum of about Two
Hundred Thirty-nine and 56/100 (\$239.56) Dollars. That your
applicants have made overtures and efforts to said Socie-
ties for the purpose of collecting the said sums of money,
but that said Societies have refused to pay the same over to
these applicants unless letters of administration be issued
by some court. *Tower's burial expenses in Dallas County, Tex.*

Wherefore, your applicants show to the court that a neo-
cessity exists in the interest of the estate of the said Arthur
M. Peck for the immediate appointment of a temporary adminis-
trator for the purpose of collecting the above mentioned sums

Peck, deceased, with the power and authority to collect the above mentioned sums of money, or of any sums of money which the said Societies, or either of them may owe to the estate of Arthur M. Peck at the time of his decease; and that such temporary administrator also have power to execute and give all proper receipts and releases to the said Societies, and each of them for such sums of money as he collects therefrom.
