

I, John Lamer of the County
and State aforesaid, being of sound mind
and disposing memory - knowing the uncertainty
of life and the certainty of death, publish and
ordain this my last will and testament.

1st That my remains be decently
interred and that the expenses thereof be paid
by the first monies that may come into the
hands of my executor.

2^d That all of my lawful debt be
paid out of any monies coming into the hands
of my Executor.

3^e That my property of every description
~~both real and personal~~ left in the charge
of my executor and that my real estate be
settled or improved in such manner as will
be most advantageous to the interest of my
minor children, and that all the rents and
profits thereof be faithfully applied to the
support and education of my children until
they arrive at years of maturity, or until the
marriage of my daughter Lucy Anne. Then all
of my said property to be equally divided between
my minor children except, the 320 acre tract of
land upon which my son Archer now lives.
This last mentioned tract of land I will and
bequeath to my son Archer his heirs and assigns,
forever, without reversion or remainder to my
minor children.

4^t I will that my son Archer divide
the above mentioned property equally between my
children as above suggested, and that no

proceeding whatever he has in the probate
Court over my property until or unless it
may be necessary to probate this will and
then that no further proceeding be had than the
probating this will and filing an inventory of
the property of my estate.

Having the most implicit confidence in
my son Archer and believing he will devote
himself to the best interest of my children
and best protect the little I may or am able
to leave them I appoint him my sole executor
of this my last will and Testament

I commend all of my children
to the infinite mercies of Almighty God.
