Beginning at a Stake the S.E cor of said  
Survey and S.W. cor to of Mr Patterson, 320 acres survey  
from which a Post oak tree E 10 rods. another tree N 30° E  
7 rods.

Thence west with the S. line of said Survey  
460.170. rods Bear Creek.

Thence up said creek with its meanders to a  
small Spotted Oak. Cor to Roseline Borah, Martha  
Borah and Mary J. Boyd Survey.

Thence E 867 rods a Stake in the W. line of  
Patterson's 320 acre Survey.

Thence S 937 $\frac{1}{2}$  rods to the place of beginning  
together with all the rights and privileges belonging  
to the same or in any way incident thereto. To have

have this day, given granted and relinquished unto

forever all of the following described lands to wit,  
One hundred & sixtysix acres, being the south part of  
a 330 acre survey granted to J. M. Patterson a assignee  
of Pleasant M. Smith, situated and described as follows  
In Dallas county, on the waters of Bear Creek about  
thirteen miles N 12° west from Dallas known as  
the W. half of Section No 31 in Township 1 north of  
~~the first base line~~, in Range 3 west of the first  
Meridian by virtue of certificate No. 475 issued by  
The Commissioner of Peters Colony on the 7<sup>th</sup> day  
of May 1851, and transferred to said Patterson on  
the 13<sup>th</sup> January 1853.


