and unable to attend to business matters.
That for several years prior to his death
the said Michael Roe was engaged in busi-
ness as a retail liquor dealer at what
was known as the "Old Corner" at the inter-
section of Elm St. and the H&T.C. Ry. in
Dallas, Texas. That his license as a
dealer at the time of his death was only
paid up to Nov. 20, 1882, the tax collectors
having delayed the collection of the license
tax for the year beginning on Nov 21, 1882
on account of the ill health of the said
M. Roe and his inability to attend his

Alcohol, apothecaries, manufacturers, basket-blanchers or makers, blacksmiths, boat-builders, book-sellers' stock, brass-founders, brush-makers, cabinet-makers stock, carvers, china or earthen or glass-ware or looking glasses unpacked, and buildings in which the same are packed or unpacked, chocolate-makers, colormen's stock, comb-makers, confectioners or their stock, coopers, druggists, ether, founders, grate-makers, hats of chip or grass, or straw bleaching, jewellers' stock, lamp manufacturers, lime unslacked, lithographers, mathematical or musical or optical instrument sellers, or performers' stock, Morocco manufacturers, painters, pictures, platters or plated ware manufacturers, prints, printers of newspapers, rag stores, ship chandlers, silversmiths' or stationers' stock, soap-makers, spirits of turpentine, stove manufacturers, tin or sheet iron workers, tobacco manufacturers, toy shop keepers' stock, turners, upholstry manufacturers, varnish, watch-makers' stock, tools etc., window or plate glass unpacked.

I. XIV.—Cisterns, Fences, Privies and other Yard Fixtures, also Store Furniture, Fixtures and Gas Fixtures, must be separately and specifically insured.

No. 1.—Frozen Work, or gilding on walls or ceilings, is not covered by insurance on the building, but may be separately insured.

No. 2.—Builders' Risk.—The working of carpenters, roofers, timsmiths, gas fitters, plumbers, or other mechanics, in building, altering or repairing the premises named in this Policy will vitiate the same, unless permission for such work be endorsed in writing hereon.
