It is further ordered that said Sam A.Leake,is be given the further power to pay out of said funds the court costs incurred herein, a fee of \$25.00 to himself for services herein rendered,besides the 50 cents advanced as alleged in said exhibit and to pay the funeral expenses with the balance of said funds,or so much of said expenses as the balance of said funds will pay after having paid the items hereinbefore ordered to be paid.

It is further ordered that after having complied with the further orders made in this judgment that the said Leake,be discharged from further liability on his bond as Temporary Guardian.

To the Honorable Kenneth Foree, Judge of said court:-

Your petitioner, Geo. H. Taylor, a resident of Cook County, State of Illinois, represents and shows to the court that he is a brother of Charles S. Taylor, who departed this life on the 17th day of April, 1900 in the City and County of Dallas, State of Texas. That he left no will, was never married and survived both his father and mother. That his surviving heirs are your petitioner, Mrs. A. J. Davis, Mrs. H. G. Anneger and Miss Hattie Taylor, all of Decorra, Illinois, Mrs. H. M. Allison of Stronghurst, Illinois and Frank Taylor, Chicago, Illinois, all brothers and sisters of the deceased.

Your petitioner further says that deceased left an estate to which his heirs are entitled and that there is a necessity for an administration upon said estate. That same consists of debts due the said deceased from lumber firms throughout the state and possibly in other states, aggregating, so far as your petitioner can now ascertain, of several hundred dollars.
