This administrator further represents that in view of the premises  
there is no reason why this administration should not be closed up  
at once.

Wherefore he prays that this report be approved, and that he be  
directed to first pay all costs and expenses incident to this  
proceeding, taking proper vouchers therefor, and that he pay the  
remainder of said money, after paying such expenses, over to Mrs Mary  
Turner, who is the person and only person legally entitled to the

Now comes S. Bonner, and makes application to be appointed temporary administrator of the estate of Mrs. Maggie Murphy, and respectfully shows to the Court:

That applicant resides in Dallas County, Texas; that the said Maggie Murphy, a widow, departed this life on or about the 2nd day of September 1904, and left no will; that the only relative or heir at law, left by said, Maggie Murphy, is her sister, Mary Turner, who resides in the City and State of New York; that the said Maggie Murphy did not owe any debts of any character at time of her death and the only property owned by her at that time of any character was \$135.00, cash, which was on deposit in her account, in the American National Bank of Dallas, Texas; that said Mary Turner, only surviving relative or heir of said Maggie Murphy is entitled to receive said money from said bank, but said bank is unwilling to pay the same over to her except through an administrator, or unless she executes and delivers to it, a good and solvent bond, to be in force during four years from date of death of said Maggie Murphy, which bond said Mary Turner is unable to give, except at considerable cost. That the only purpose of this administration is to collect said money and turn same over to the person entitled to receive same.

Wherefore petitioner prays the Court to enter an order, appointing him as temporary administrator of the estate of Maggie Murphy, deceased, with full power and authority to collect said money from said bank, receipt therefor, and turn same over to the person entitled to receive same, under orders of this Court.
