

Overton on the 5th day of Sept. 1390 executed in writing in due

form of law his last will and testament, thereby disposing of all

his property of every nature, and therein appointed your petitioner

sole executrix, without bond, of his said last will and testament.

That said will was signed by the said William P. Overton, and witnessed by M.V.Cole, Chas.A. Rasberry and John Bookhout.

That the estate of the said William P. Overton consist of personal property situated in Dallas County, Texas in the state aforesaid, and of the probable value of \$200.00. That your petitioner is a citizen of Dallas County, Texas , and is not disqualified by law from accepting letters testamentary.

WHEREFORE your petitioner comes and files seid last will and testament, and this application for the Probate of said will, and prays that notice be given and letters testamentary thereon be issued to your petitioner and for all other proper relief, and your petitioner will ever pray & etc.

Overton, of Dallas county, Texas, being
of sound mind and disposing memory,

and knowing the uncertainty of lift, even to the young, and having passed the meridian of life, do hereby make this my last will and testament for the disposition of all of my property after my death, hereby revoking all other wills and bequests heretofore made by me, but hereby expressly ratifying a certain deed heretofore executed by me to my beloved wife, Mrs. Jessie F. Overton.

Item 1st: 1 will and devise that all my just debts be paid in full.

Item 2nd: Whereas, my oldest son, Aubrey L. Overton, has heretofore received from me his full share from his mother's and my estate, amounting to about four hundred and forty acres of land, and has expressed to me his entire satisfaction of the amount so received, I hereby ratify said gift heretofore made, and in addition thereto bequeath to him the sum of twenty five dollars, to be paid to him by my executrix hereinafter named, the same to be paid in full for all interest either in his mother's estate or mine.

Item 3d: Whereas, my son, W.W. Overton, of Dallas county, Texas, has heretofore received from me about one hundred and seventy acres of land, situated in Dallas county, Texas, together with the improvements thereon, also one span of mules and a wagon, for which he has expressed his full satisfaction for all the interest he has in his mother's or my estate, I hereby ratify said gifts, and in addition thereto device and bequeath to him the sum of twenty five dollars, the same to be paid by my executrix in full for his interest either in my own or his mother's estate.

Item 4th: I hereby device and bequeath to my wife, Mrs. Jessie F. Overton, the sum of fifty dollars per year, to be used and expend-

ed by her in the care, maintenance, support and tender treatment of my daughter, Mollie Overton, and I commend to my executrix the care and support of my said daughter, feeling sure that should said sum not be sufficient for her support and maintenance, that my said wife, Mrs. Jessie F. Overton, will supply any deficiency for her care and support and maintenance, my desire being that said Mollie Overton shall not want for any of the comforts of life.

Item 5th: I hereby will, devise and bequeath to my step-son, Joe C. Price, the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, which amount I desire to be invested in a horse, saddle and bridle, by my executrix and the same delivered to him.

Item 6th: I will, devine and bequeath to my beloved wife, Mrs. Jessie F. Overton, of Dallas county, Texas, all the balance of my estate of whatsoever nature and description and where-ever the same may be situated, real, personal or mixed, choses in action, possession or expectancy, to have and to hold unto her in her own name forever.

Item 7th: I hereby appoint my wife, Mrs. Jessie F. Overton, sole executrix of this my last will and testament; and it is my desire that she shall not be required to give any bond, and that she shall have authority to mortgage, sell or convey any portion, or all, of my estate; and further, that no action shall be taken by the probate court in the matter of my estate other than to probate and record this my last will and testament and to return an inventory and appraisement of the same.
