To the Hon. Ed S. Lauderdale, County Judge:

Your petitioner, M. H. Thomas, a resident citizen of Dallas County, Texas, makes this application for appointment as temporary administrator for the estate of N. B. Slean, and as ground for his said application shows,

1. That N. B. Slean died in the City and County of Dallas in the State of Texas on the 18th day of September, 1902.

That at the time of his death his residence and domicile was in the said City of Dallas, State aforesaid, and that a portion of his estate was and is situated in Dallas County, Texas, in this, that M. H. Thomas & Company holds for the account and for the said N. B. Slean about the sum of \$750.00 in money;

That said decedent died intestate, so far as your petitioner can ascertain; that it is possible that said decedent had money in other banks in the City of Dallas and assets in said Dallas County unknown to your petitioner;

That your petitioner is advised and informed that said decedent had at the time of his death about \$1750.00 or more in the Continental National Bank of St. Louis, Mo.

That the extent and probable value of said estate, so far as can be ascertained by your petitioner, will probably exceed \$2500.00.

That a necessity exists for such temporary administration, for this, that the decedent at the time of his death, was the husband of Lizzie Slean, who resides in or near Savannah in the Indian Territory, that the only child the fruits of said marriage, is E. P. Slean a boy 19 years of age.
