Shelton a Notary Public in and for Collin County Texas, on this day personally appeared Lee Holmes known to me to be the person whose name is subscribed to the foregoing instrument, and who after being by me duly sworn on his oath said that he knows W. G. Gregory and that he knew Tom McNichols who was killed near Sachse a few days ago, that he was present in the town of Plano on Saturday the 27th, day of Oct. 1900, and that he proposed to Tom McNichol to buy or trade for a certain brown horse about 15 hands high, about 7 years old, and being known as the J. W. Shepard horse, and as Affiant thought belonged to Tom McNichols, or rather he knew that he had belonged to Tom McNichols, and in answer to Affiant's proposition to buy or trade for said horse, the said Tom McNichols in the presence of W. G. Gregory answered he is not my horse, I have sold him to W. G. Gregory for \$40.00, and Gregory has paid me the money, and I have borrowed the horse from him to ride to my home near Sachse, and will return him to W. G. Gregory at Plano on next Monday evening.

Vanness known to me to be the person whose name is subscribed to the foregoing instrument, and after being by me duly sworn on his oath said that he knows W. G. Gregory and that he knew Tom McNichol who was killed near Sachse a few days agoe, that he was present in the town of Plano, on Saturday the 27th, day of Oct. 1900, and heard a trade and conversation between W. G. Gregory and Tom McNichol, and heard Tom McNichol's sell to W. G. Gregory one certain brown horse about 15 hands high, about 7 years old, and known as the J. W. Shepard horse, that Tom McNichols at said time and place sold said horse to W. G. Gregory at and for the sum of \$40.00 and that W. G. Gregory paid said \$40.00 to Tom McNichols in his presence, and said Tom McNichols delivered said horse to said W. G. Gregory, and that W. G. Gregory loaned said horse to Tom McNichols to ride to his home near Sachse, under a promise made by said Tom McNichols that he would return said horse to Gregory on the following Monday evening, and Tom McNichols rode said horse away, this is the same Tom McNichols that was killed near Sachse on Monday last. I saw the above described horse at Garland Texas on Monday Oct. 29th in the possession of Dick Edwards.

Gregory known to me to be the person whose name is subscribed to the foregoing instrument, and after being by me duly sworn on his oath said that he is the owner of, and is entitled to the possession of one certain brown horse, about 15 hands high, about 7 years old, branded on the left hip, but brand not remembered, and is known as the J. W. Shepard horse.

Affiant says that on the 27th, day of Oct. 1900 he bought said horse from Tom McNichol and that he paid Tom McNichol's therefor the sum of \$40.00 cash, and which said sum was the full purchase price agreed on for said horse, and that then and there the said Tom McNichol delivered said horse to this Affiant, and that thereafter he loaned said horse to Tom McNichols to ride to his home near Sachse in Dallas County Texas, under a promise from the said Tom McNichols that he would return said horse on the following Monday evening. Affiant further says that said horse was never returned to him, and that he is informed and believes that the said Tom McNichols was killed near Sachse on Monday the 29th, day of Oct. 1900, and that said horse is now in the possession of S. D. Smith Constable at Garland Texas, and that his claim to said horse is made in good faith.
