The State of Texas In District Court
County of Dallas, June Term AD 1871

To the Honorable Hardin Hart Judge of the 14th
Judicial District of Texas, holding sessions in
Dallas County:

Your petitioner John D. Lorenx a citizen
of Dallas County would most respectfully repre-
sent that heretofore, to wit on the day of
AD 1847, petitioner's wife, Mary Frueky,
formerly Mary Deenut departed this life leaving
one child, ^{John Henry Lorenx, a minor} a son of said Mary and petitioner,
now aged about three years, that said
child is entitled as heir to his mother,
the said Mary, to an interest in the Es-
tate of A. Stie of the Kingdom of Bel-
gium - amounting to about three thousand
dollars in gold, personal property; that
said John Henry Frueky is now living with
petitioner in Dallas County Texas.

Wherefore petitioner asks that he be appointed
guardian of the Estate of said minor, and that
after complying with the orders of Court in this be-
half. Letters of Guardianship of the estate of said
minor issue to him, and as in duty bound he

To all to Whom these Presents May Come--Greeting:

KNOW YE, That John B. Loucky as
Principal, and Henry Boll, John Dupot & Wm Vanprouderbak
as sureties, are held and firmly bound unto
the District Clerk of the county of Dallas, in the sum of Seven
Thousand Dollars, for the payment of which,
well and truly to be made unto the said District Clerk
County Judge, we bind ourselves, our heirs, execu-
tors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Signed with
our hands, and sealed with our seals, the seals being scrolls, the third day of
July A. D. 1871.

The Condition of the above obligation, is such, That whereas the above
bound John B. Loucky has been appointed
Guardian of the Estate of John Henry
Loucky - a minor son of said John B.,
Now, if the said John B. Loucky shall well and truly
perform all the duties required of him under said appointment, then this obliga-
tion shall be null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect
