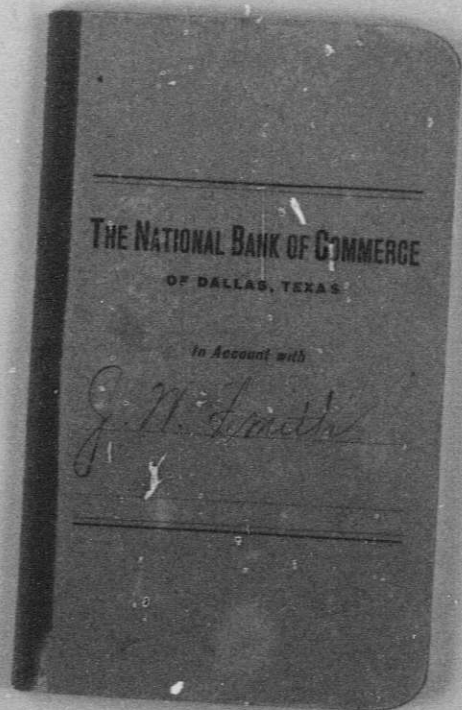

B. F. Cullom shows to the Court
that J. W. Smith died in Dallas County,
Texas on Feb 3rd 1905 and that he
had in the Natl Bank of Commerce
a small amount of money, not
exceeding \$15.⁰⁰ or \$20.⁰⁰, and that
decedent was an old negro, with no
relatives so far as can be learned;
that he lived with an old negress,
Alice Tillis, who is desirous of
burying said decedent in the Colored
Cemetery instead of allowing him to
be buried in the Potters field, ~~and~~
but cannot make the bond necessary
to get the money out of the bank
and requests this applicant to
do so.

Wherefore he asks that he
be appointed temporary Administra-
tor of said estate with power
to collect said money and turn
it over to Alice Tillis, that she
may use it in assisting her
to bury ~~the~~ decedent, but ap-
plicant asks for no other powers.

He further states that there is
no probability of any Court costs
in the matter ever being paid, as
he desires to turn all the money over
to said Alice Tillis.
