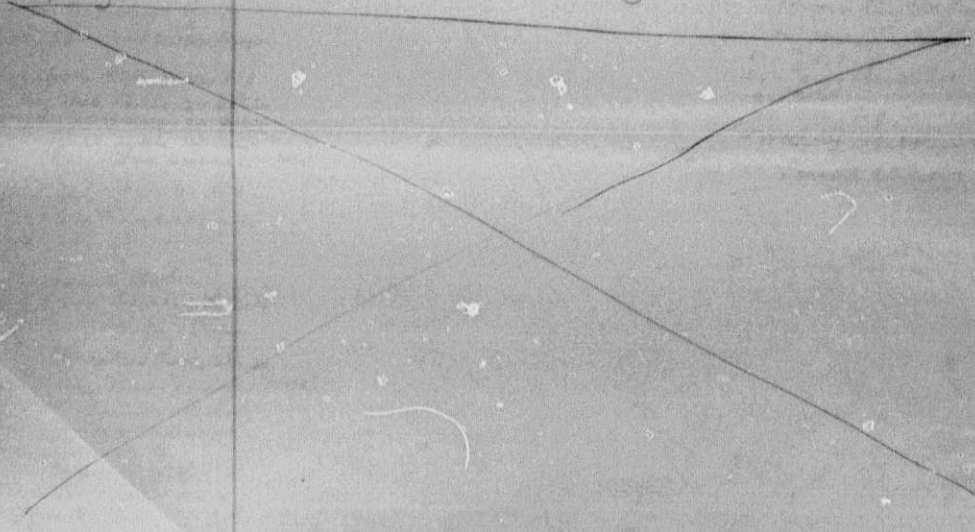

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In the course of my business many goods have been sold but admin is unable to state specifically what some are, except as below set out. For the reason that many goods are shipped to agents for sale and many are carried in stock at the store in San Antonio, Texas and Mobile, Ala. belonging to said estate and it cannot be stated which of same are still on hand and which have been sold until reports of sales are made to Deless.

Many sales have been made partly for cash at this place, a list of which appears below, and but for the most part on credit throughout the territory covering Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Ala., Ga.

to large numbers of people, on written contracts therefor known in the business as "leases" which for a great part of the time are kept in the hands of collectors on the ground, who make daily reports of their collections and remit to the Deless office three times a week, deducting their salaries and expenses. Said leases appear in the books, ^{and as original leases} at this office, but it is impossible to state them from which were taken after the time of this admin's qualification, as the dates thereof are not kept at said office. This admin has continued the same system of business and bookkeeping used by decedent for the reason that a change would have caused great confusion and increase of labor. Leave from this office are given ^{but only for genuine, not illegitimate} sales of goods for cash from Deless office.
