Testament, I give, and devise and bequeath, my estate
and property, real and personal, as follows.

I will my wife and son John Two Hundred
acres of land including the residence and several
of the farm as will fall within the two hundred acres as
aforesaid, together with the farming implements belonging
thereto, also the stock of Hogs now on hand, and three head
of work horses or mules, and one bred mare, also four milk
cows. It is my will that my wife Mary T. Campbell have
the full use and control of the above described premises
during her natural life, or until my son John T. Campbell
becomes of age, at which time he may take charge of said
premises and furnish all necessary support to his
mother during her natural life, and at her death have
full possession of said premises.

I will that all my other property, both real
and personal shall be divided equally among my
other children, viz: H. L. Campbell, Mrs. L. A. Penta
Mrs. S. E. Wilcox, Charles C. Levison, S. J. L. Campbell
and James Campbell son of Jas. W. Campbell Sr. &
Mrs. Sallie S. Fugate and Alice S. Campbell.

I will that at my death or as soon thereafter as
my executors deem proper and best, all my horses
mules and cattle be sold, debts and accounts collected
and the proceeds divided among my children's grand
son as aforesaid, so as to make the shares equal after
deducting, as nearly as can be ascertained, the amounts
herebefore given to each, and every heir.

I will that the Courts of the County shall have nothing
to do with my estate further than receive from the Executors
an Inventory of Property and Probate this will.
