 of Dallas, Texas, departed this
 life intestate, dying at his home
 in said City of Dallas -
 That said Decedent, leaving a
 aforesaid, intestate left an
 Estate consisting of personal
 property, to wit, Household Goods
 and Chattels; Live Stock, viz, horses
 mules & Cattle; Railroad grading
 implements and waggons; and
 money in hand and due on
 account; - the probable value
 of which said Estate is about
 Twenty-five hundred (\$2500.⁰⁰)

Further your applicant shows that there are divers debts and accounts against said Estate, and owing and now due to divers creditors from same.

That said Decedent, John Bennett left surviving him a widow and two minor daughters; - That the said widow, whose first right and privilege it is to administer said Decedent's, - her said husband's Estate - has heretofore failed and refused, and now fails, and utterly refuses to administer said Estate, or to pay debts due from it; -

That your applicant does not know of any relative of Decedent qualified to have letters of administration issue to him; Applicant further states that he is a creditor of said Estate to the amount of One hundred and Ninety-two - 80 (192.80) Dollars - which is due and unpaid.
