To the Hon. E. G. Bowen
Judge of the County Court of
Dallas County:—

Your petitioner
R. F. Robert who is a resident
citizen of the County of Dallas
in the State of Texas would re-
spectfully show unto your Honor
that heretofore to wit on the 15th
day of September 1886 A. J. Robert
died in the city of Dallas, State
of Texas. That said A. J. Robert
was a brother of your petitioner
and at the time of and before his
death was a resident citizen
of Dallas County, that the deceased
left a will disposing of all his
property both real and personal
which said property or the greater
part of it is situated in the counties
of Wichita and Dallas consisting of
land and a one half interest in
a stock of liquors and bar fix-
tures. That the value of said estate
is about twelve thousand dol-
lars (\$12,000⁰⁰). That there are no
debts against said estate and
the will which is hereto annexed
is wholly in the handwriting of
the testator and does not name
any one as executor.

Your petitioner prays that
he may be appointed executor of

said estate if Your Honor in
his wisdom should think the
appointment of an executor neces-
sary; that there is no ~~reason~~ legal
reason why he should not be appoint-
ed such executor or accept letters
testamentary.

Your petition further prays
that she will be admitted to pro-
bate; that citation issue to all
persons interested in said estate
and that such other orders be made
in the premises as to the Court may
seem necessary
