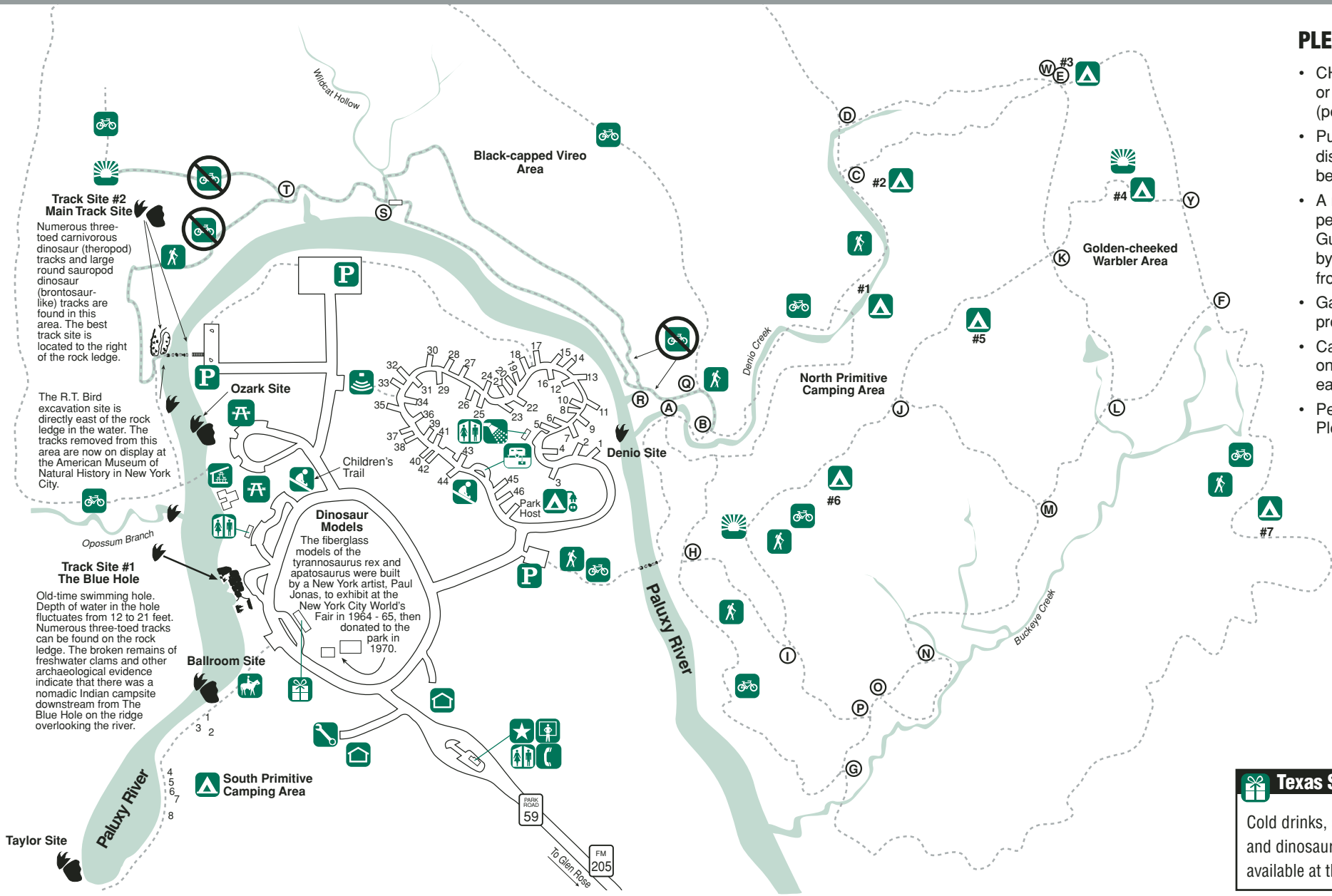

**Track Site #2 Main Track Site**  
Numerous three-toed carnivorous dinosaur (theropod) tracks and large round sauropod dinosaur (brontosaur-like) tracks are found in this area. The best track site is located to the right of the rock ledge.

The R.T. Bird excavation site is directly east of the rock ledge in the water. The tracks removed from this area are now on display at the American Museum of Natural History in New York City.

**Track Site #1 The Blue Hole**  
Old-time swimming hole. Depth of water in the hole fluctuates from 12 to 21 feet. Numerous three-toed tracks can be found on the rock ledge. The broken remains of freshwater clams and other archaeological evidence indicate that there was a nomadic Indian campsite downstream from The Blue Hole on the ridge overlooking the river.

**Dinosaur Models**  
The fiberglass models of the tyrannosaurus rex and apatosaurus were built by a New York artist, Paul Jonas, to exhibit at the New York City World's Fair in 1964 - 65, then donated to the park in 1970.
