Longhorn Cavern STATE PARK

A state park featuring a Texas Hill Country wonder. Longhorn Cavern was created over many years by the dissolving and cutting action of water on the limestone bedrock. Fossils, Texas history, legends and rumors all play a unique part in the story of Longhorn Cavern. The park offers tours to entertain and educate.



Guided Tours: Call (512) 756-4680 for current times. Regular Tours: 363 days a year, 1-1/2-hour walking tour that covers about 1-1/4-miles round-trip. Specialty Tours and Events: Call (512) 715-0255.



Gift Shop and Grill: Unique items/gifts from around the world. Deli snacks, sandwiches, salads, drinks.



Picnicking: Shaded tables.

Trails: 1/2-mile nature trail (Backbone Ridge); 1-1/2-mile hiking trail through scenic oak-juniper country.



Exhibit Center: Interpretive exhibits featuring the Civilian Conservation Corps in original administration building.

Fee charged for conducted tours. Picnic area, self-guided hiking trails and exhibit center are free. No overnight available.

Camping is available at nearby state parks including: Inks Lake, Enchanted Rock and Pedernales Falls. Nearby attractions include Vanishing Texas River Cruise, Confederate Air Museum, Fort Croghan Museum and Buchanan Dam.
