
STATE PARK

Located between Aransas and St. Charles bays, Goose Island State Park is an angler's paradise and a bird watcher's dream. The bays' shallow waters reward fishing enthusiasts with catches of speckled trout, redfish, drum, and flounder. Blue crabs are also abundant and a preferred delicacy of the endangered Whooping Cranes that visit every winter. The park is also home to the famous "Big Tree," a 1,000-year-old coastal live oak that has survived prairie fires, Civil War battles, and hurricanes, Goose Island is a favorite and reservations are recommended.










Boating: Boat ramp with fish cleaning station.
