CAPCOG honors Mike Fisher for regional leadership

Mike Fisher, Bastrop County's emergency management coordinator, has been named the 2012 recipient of the Capital Area Council of Governments' Jack Griesenbeck Leadership in Regionalism Award.

The ninth annual award, announced at the CAPCOG General Assembly's annual meeting on Dec. 12, honors significant efforts in regional cooperation within the 10-county capital area.

Fisher was recognized for long-standing dedication to wildfire prevention and for tireless support and commitment to emergency response with a regional approach.

Mandatory criminal justice grant workshops rescheduled

The session on the General Victim Assistance - Direct Services Programs grant and the Violent Crimes Against Women Criminal Justice and Training Projects funding is rescheduled to Jan. 23.

After potential recipients attend the mandatory workshop for their preferred grant and submit applications to the Governor's Criminal Justice Division, the state agency will forward applications to CAPCOG for review, prioritization and recommendations.

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CAPCOG WebEOC plays role in Formula One response

When the Formula One U.S. Grand Prix racing event and all the attendant excitement hit Central Texas last fall, CAPCOG helped ensure that local, state and federal agencies responsible for coordinating traffic management and public safety were able to effectively coordinate their activities.

A key component? CAPCOG's implementation of crisis information software WebEOC, used to share real-time updates during the three days of F1 activities at the new Circuit of the Americas racetrack in southeast Austin and at the Formula 1 Fan Fest in downtown Austin.

WebEOC, a Web-based information tool, allows personnel from multiple agencies at divergent locations to share information and keep abreast of actions being taken by others. This shared awareness helps users coordinate activities and identify problems that need to be addressed.

The regional WebEOC system, administered by CAPCOG's Homeland Security Division since the application's 2004 implementation at the request of CAPCOG's Homeland Security Task Force, has steadily grown in users. The system now supports local governments, all school districts and hospitals and various state-affiliated emergency management and response personnel.

During the F1 weekend, medical personnel including emergency medical services professionals and representatives of area hospitals used WebEOC to track calls for medical treatment as well as the

availability of hospitals to help in case of a major incident involving a large number of casualties.

David Reimer, executive director of the Capital Area Trauma Regional Advisory Council, headed up the Regional Medical Operations Center during F1 activities. Reimer credited WebEOC with providing the detailed, up-to-date information that proved invaluable in ensuring emergency medical personnel and hospitals would be able to respond if needed.

Otis Latin, who directs the City of Austin's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and shared responsibility for overall coordination of response activities, stated that WebEOC provided the means by which public and private agencies of all types were able to share information that helped guarantee success in managing the challenges posed by Formula One. With the eyes of the world upon Austin, he noted, it was critical that this event be managed successfully, and WebEOC helped make that happen.

Did you know?

Local, state and federal agencies - along with school districts, hospitals and a variety of other public safety-related entities — can access the WebEOC software.

In the field? No problem. Authorized personnel can log in to the application using virtually any device - smartphone, tablet or laptop, for example — that has a Web browser.

Staff will continue expanding the scope of WebEOC's uses based on participants' feedback.
