



PUBLIC HUNTING PROGRAMS

ANNUAL PUBLIC HUNTING (APH) PERMIT — \$48


- Hunt white-tailed deer, feral hogs, dove, quail, turkey, waterfowl, rabbit, squirrel and more
- Over 180 hunting areas, including wildlife management areas, state parks and approximately 110 dove and small game areas leased from private landowners
- Youth Only and Youth/Adult hunts for deer, waterfowl, dove, quail, squirrel and feral hogs
- Fishing, camping, hiking, nature watching, photography and equestrian use are also available on these areas



- A \$12 Limited Public Use (LPU) Permit provides access to the same areas as the APH at a reduced cost for fishing, hiking, camping, bird watching, picnicking, wildlife viewing and equestrian use
- APH and LPU permits are available at:
- Any of the **TPWD offices** listed on the back of this brochure, including the headquarters in Austin
- Any retail hunting and fishing license dealer (such as sporting goods stores)

DRAWN HUNTS

- Hunts for alligator, pronghorn, white-tailed deer, mule deer, javelina, exotic mammals, turkey and more
- Guided hunt packages for African exotics and native big game that include food and lodging
- Application fees that range from \$3 to \$10 are required per adult per application and permit fees range from \$80 to \$130 for most hunts, some have no permit fees



- Eight Youth Only categories, which allow kids under adult supervision to hunt deer, exotics, alligator, turkey, javelina and feral hogs
- No application or permit fees for youth hunters
- Application deadlines range from early August through October
- Application cards, hunt schedules and instructions can be found in the Drawn Hunt Booklet (see PUBLICATIONS section for availability)

REGULAR (DAILY) HUNTING PERMIT — \$20

- Purchased at designated hunting areas for dove, quail, waterfowl and squirrel hunts (youth under 17 free with permitted adult)
- These areas are found in the Drawn Hunt Booklet

PUBLICATIONS

- The Public Hunting Lands Map Booklet is provided to APH and LPU Permit holders. It is available at the time of purchase at TPWD offices, or it will be mailed if the permit is purchased at a retail hunting and fishing license dealer


