SECTION 6. Section 504.315, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:

20 (j) The department shall issue specialty license plates for 21 recipients of the Prisoner of War Medal. License plates issued 22 under this subsection must include the Prisoner of War Medal emblem 23 and must include the words "Prisoner of War Medal" at the bottom of 24 each plate.

27 SECTION 8. The Texas Department of Motor Vehicles is not
