3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 455.004(b) and (c), Transportation
5	Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(b) The members of the committee shall be appointed by the
7	governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
8	representatives, who shall each appoint:
9	(1) one member who represents a diverse cross-section
10	of public transportation providers and may be employed by a transit
11	provider or organization representing transit providers;
12	(2) one member who represents a diverse cross-section
13	of transportation users and may not be employed by a transit
14	provider or organization representing transit providers; and
15	(3) one member who represents the general public <u>and</u>
16	who may be on the staff of a metropolitan planning organization or
17	rural transportation planning organization but may not be employed
18	by a transit provider or organization representing transit
19	providers.
20	(c) Members serve for staggered terms of six years, with the
21	terms of three members expiring on February 1 of each odd-numbered
22	year. A vacancy on the committee shall be filled in the same manner
23	as the original appointment for that position [A member serves at
24	the pleasure of the officer who appointed the member]. A member is

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1 not entitled to compensation for service on the committee but is 2 entitled to reimbursement for reasonable expenses the member incurs 3 in performing committee duties.

4 SECTION 2. (a) The terms of the public transportation 5 advisory committee members serving on the effective date of this 6 Act expire January 31, 2017.

7 The changes in law made by this Act to Section (b) 8 455.004(b), Transportation Code, apply only to a member of the 9 public transportation advisory committee with a term beginning on 10 or after the effective date of this Act. A member of the public 11 transportation advisory committee with a term beginning before the 12 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect 13 immediately before that date, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 14

15 (c) Notwithstanding the changes in law made by this Act, a 16 member of the public transportation advisory committee with a term 17 beginning before the effective date of this Act may be reappointed 18 to the committee under Section 455.004, Transportation Code.

(d) The governor, lieutenant governor, and speaker of the house of representatives each shall appoint three members to the committee, in accordance with Section 455.004, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, for terms beginning February 1, 2017, with one member having a term expiring February 1, 2019, one member having a term expiring February 1, 2021, and one member having a term expiring February 1, 2023.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.



PROCLAMATION BY THE Governor of the State of Texas 41-3423

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

Pursuant to Article IV, Section 14, of the Texas Constitution, I, Greg Abbott, Governor of Texas, do hereby disapprove of and veto House Bill No. 499 as passed by the Eighty-Fourth Texas Legislature, Regular Session, because of the following objections:

House Bill 499 unnecessarily limits the field of candidates available for appointment to the Public Transportation Advisory Committee by the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and the Speaker of the House. The bill also guarantees committee members a term of six years, which eliminates the appointing officers' ability to replace members at any time for poor performance. The appointment limitations in House Bill 499 would impede the appointing officers' ability to provide effective committee members to serve Texas.

Since the Eighty-Fourth Texas Legislature, Regular Session, by its adjournment has prevented the return of this bill, I am filing these objections in the office of the Secretary of State and giving notice thereof by this public proclamation according to the aforementioned constitutional provision.
