## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, A life dedicated to the service of his state and
- 2 nation has drawn to a close with the death of the Honorable Leo
- 3 Berman of Tyler on May 23, 2015, at the age of 79; and
- WHEREAS, Leo Berman was born on October 21, 1935; the son of
- 5 immigrant parents from Poland and Latvia, he earned his bachelor's
- 6 degree in political science from Southern Methodist University and
- 7 then embarked upon an outstanding 22-year career in the U.S. Army;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Mr. Berman graduated first in his class at the
- 10 army's Field Artillery School Officer Candidate School, and he also
- 11 received diplomas from the army's Air Defense Artillery and Missile
- 12 School, Armor School, and Command and General Staff College; he
- 13 served two tours of duty in Vietnam, and he held appointment as an
- 14 army liaison to Congress for three years; he retired in 1976 at the
- 15 rank of lieutenant colonel; and
- WHEREAS, This courageous soldier earned numerous military
- 17 awards, including three Bronze Stars, the Meritorious Service
- 18 Medal, nine Air Medals, the Army Commendation Medal with oak leaf
- 19 cluster, the National Defense Service Medal with oak leaf cluster,
- 20 and the Vietnam Service Medal with three bronze service stars, as
- 21 well as the Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross with palm and the
- 22 Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces Honor Medal first class; in 2009,
- 23 he was promoted to colonel in the Texas State Guard, and his state
- 24 awards included the Texas Distinguished Service Medal, the Texas

Outstanding Service Medal, the Texas Medal of Merit, the Texas 2 Federal Service Medal, and the Texas State Guard Service Medal; and 3 WHEREAS, After returning to civilian life, Mr. Berman worked 4 as a public affairs executive for Sun Exploration and Production Company from 1980 to 1991; he also threw himself into public 5 6 service, seeking and winning election to the Arlington City Council 7 in 1979 and serving six years, including two as mayor pro tem; in 8 addition, he received gubernatorial appointments to the board of 9 the Texas Army National Guard Armory and to the Texas Advisory 10 Commission on Intergovernmental Relations, which he also chaired; 11 and WHEREAS, Mr. Berman first won election to the

12 Texas 13 Legislature in 1998, and he served seven terms, until 2013; during 14 his exemplary 14-year tenure as the state representative from 15 District 6, he chaired the Committee on Elections and the Committee on Defense Affairs and State-Federal Relations Subcommittee on 16 17 Budget and Oversight and served as vice chair of the Committee on 18 House Administration; his other committee assignments included 19 Appropriations, Higher Education, and Government Reform; Mr. Berman's accomplishments included helping The University of 20 21 Texas at Tyler start a nursing program; he was especially attentive to the concerns of his individual constituents, and he took pride in 22 the fact that he answered every phone call, e-mail, and letter 23 personally; and 24

25 WHEREAS, A man of strong Christian faith, Leo Berman attended Christ Episcopal Church in Tyler, where he was a leading lay member; 26 he also gave generously of his time and talents as a member of the 27

- 1 executive committee of the East Texas Area Council of the Boy Scouts
- 2 of America and as a board member of the Bethesda Health Clinic in
- 3 Tyler, East Texas Meals on Wheels, Texas College, and the Arc of
- 4 Smith County, which named him board member emeritus; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Mr. Berman's first wife, Cara Sue Hughey Berman,
- 6 predeceased him, and later in life, he was fortunate to find love
- 7 again with his second wife, Dr. Lou Ann Berman; he was the father of
- 8 five children, and he was blessed with seven grandchildren; and
- 9 WHEREAS, A devoted family man and a dedicated public servant,
- 10 Leo Berman fought passionately for the ideals and principles in
- 11 which he believed, and the legacy he leaves behind will continue to
- 12 inspire all those who knew and loved him; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 14 hereby pay tribute to the life of Leo Berman and extend sincere
- 15 condolences to his wife, Dr. Lou Ann Berman, to his children,
- 16 grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and to his other relatives
- 17 and friends; and, be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 19 prepared for his family and that when the Texas House of
- 20 Representatives and Senate adjourn this day, they do so in memory of
- 21 the Honorable Leo Berman.
