3	being of unique ecological value.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "Region L" means
6	Regional Water Planning Area L designated in accordance with
7	Section 16.053, Water Code, as the area's boundaries existed on
8	September 1, 2015.
9	SECTION 2. DESIGNATION OF RIVER OR STREAM SEGMENTS OF
10	UNIQUE ECOLOGICAL VALUE. The legislature, as authorized by Section
11	16.051(f), Water Code, designates as being of unique ecological
12	value the following river or stream segments:
13	(1) the Nueces River from the northern boundary of
14	Region L to United States Geological Survey gauge number 08190000;
15	(2) the Frio River from the northern boundary of
16	Region L to United States Geological Survey gauge number 08195000;
17	(3) the Sabinal River from the northern boundary of
18	Region L to its intersection with State Highway 187;
19	(4) the San Marcos River from a point 0.4 miles
20	upstream from its intersection with State Highway Loop 82 to its
21	intersection with Interstate Highway 35; and
22	(5) the Comal River from its intersection with East
23	Klingemann Street in New Braunfels to its confluence with the
24	Guadalupe River.

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SECTION 3. EFFECT OF DESIGNATION. The designation of a
 river or stream segment as being of unique ecological value under
 Section 2 of this Act:

4 (1) means only that a state agency or political
5 subdivision of the state may not finance the actual construction of
6 a reservoir in the designated segment;

7 (2) does not affect the ability of a state agency or 8 political subdivision of the state to construct, operate, maintain, 9 or replace a weir, a water diversion, flood control, drainage, or 10 water supply system, a low water crossing, or a recreational 11 facility in the designated segment;

(3) does not prohibit the permitting, financing, construction, operation, maintenance, or replacement of any water management strategy to meet projected water supply needs recommended in, or designated as an alternative in, the 2011 or 2016 Regional Water Plan for Region L; and

17 (4) does not alter any existing property right of an18 affected landowner.

19 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September20 1, 2015.

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would designate specific stream segments of five rivers in Regional Water Planning Area L as having unique ecological value. The status of unique ecological value means that a state agency or any political subdivision of the state may not finance the actual construction of a reservoir in the designated segment. According to Texas Water Development Board, the 2012 State Water Plan recommends this designation for these stream segments.

The bill would take effect September 1, 2015.
