- 1 (d) Each elected justice of the peace in the county who is
- 2 not legally prohibited from voting in an election for the purpose is

- 5 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act regarding the
- 6 election of certain county bail bond board members do not affect the
- 7 entitlement of a member serving on a board immediately before the
- 8 effective date of this Act to continue to serve and function as a
- 9 member of the board for the remainder of the member's term. Those
- 10 changes in law apply only to a member elected on or after the
- 11 effective date of this Act.
