SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION WHEREAS, It is the responsibility of the federal government 2 3 to fully maintain the security of the Texas-Mexico international 4 border; and 5 WHEREAS, The federal government has neglected its duty to fully maintain the security of the Texas-Mexico international 7 border; and 8 WHEREAS, An unprotected border facilitates drug smuggling 9 and human trafficking and opens the door to spillover violence from 10 criminal cartels; moreover, the ease with which members of terrorist organizations can enter the country poses a grave threat 11 12 to homeland security; and 13 WHEREAS, The federal government's failure to prevent illegal 14 entry has shifted much of the responsibility to the State of Texas; 15 consequently, budget writers must weigh the costs of border security against the expense of other state services; during the 16 2012-2013 fiscal biennium, Texas spent \$222,068,318 on border 17 security operations, and in the 2014-2015 fiscal biennium, 18 \$467,872,482; and 19 20 WHEREAS, The executive branch and the United States Congress 21 have consistently delayed meaningful action on border security, 22 forcing Texas to expend significant resources to keep the international border with Mexico secure and placing an undue burden 23

on the state's taxpayers; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to the president of the Senate and to the speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States Congress, and to all the members of the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that this resolution be entered in the Congressional Record as a memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
