H.B. No. 1026

1 AN ACT

2 relating to eligibility for appointment as a tabulation supervisor
3 in an election.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:


5 SECTION 1. Section 127.003(b), Election Code, is amended to
6 read as follows:

7 (b) To be eligible for appointment, a person must be:


8 (1) trained in the operation of the automatic
9 tabulating equipment installed at the counting station; and

10 (2) a registered voter of the political subdivision
11 served by the authority establishing the counting station or an
12 employee of the political subdivision that adopts or owns the
13 voting system.

14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
18 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.




