


5 SECTION 1. Section 2054.133, Government Code, is amended by
6 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:

7 (f) Not later than January 13 of each odd-numbered year, the
8 department shall submit a written report to the governor, the
9 lieutenant governor, and the legislature evaluating information
10 security for this state's information resources. In preparing the
11 report, the department shall consider the information security
12 plans submitted by state agencies under this section, any
13 vulnerability reports submitted under Section 2054.077, and other
14 available information regarding the security of this state's
15 information resources. The department shall omit from any written
16 copies of the report information that could expose specific
17 vulnerabilities in the security of this state's information
18 resources.


