4	SECTION 1. Section 122.001(a), Election Code, is amended to

20	(7) prevents counting votes by the same voter for more
21	than one candidate for the same office or, in elections in which a

voter is entitled to vote for more than one candidate for the same

office, prevents counting votes for more than the number of

candidates for which the voter is entitled to vote;

- 8 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
