- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 12.056, Natural Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.056. POWERS AND DUTIES. The commission shall
- 8 confer and act jointly with representatives appointed on behalf of
- 9 the State of Oklahoma to:
- 10 (1) evaluate the methods, surveys, historical maps,
- 11 and other information used to establish the boundary line between
- 12 this state and the State of Oklahoma in the Texoma area;
- 13 (2) determine the location of the south bank of the Red
- 14 River as the bank was located and marked by the United States Army
- 15 Corps of Engineers before the beginning of construction of Lake
- 16 Texoma, in accordance with Article II(c), Red River Boundary
- 17 Compact, Section 12.002;
- 18 (3) redraw the boundary line between this state and
- 19 the State of Oklahoma on any real property for which the United
- 20 States Army Corps of Engineers granted an easement before August
- 21 31, 2000, to at least two districts or authorities created under
- 22 Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, for the construction,
- 23 operation, and maintenance of a water pipeline and related
- 24 <u>facilities</u> in the Texoma area in order to negate any effects the

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- 1 boundary as it is currently drawn has on property interests
- 2 associated with those easements in the Texoma area, in such a way
- 3 that there is no net loss of property between either state so as to
- 4 ensure that the redrawn boundary does not increase the political
- 5 power or influence of either state, and in accordance with:
- 6 (A) the Lake Texoma preconstruction survey of the
- 7 south bank of the Red River prepared by the United States Army Corps
- 8 of Engineers; or
- 9 (B) other historical records or documentation of
- 10 the United States Army Corps of Engineers identifying the location
- 11 of the south bank of the Red River, if the survey described by
- 12 Subdivision (3)(A) is unavailable;
- 13 (4) hold hearings and conferences in this state and in
- 14 the State of Oklahoma as necessary to accomplish the purposes of
- 15 this section; and
- 16 (5) take other action, alone or in cooperation with
- 17 the State of Oklahoma or the United States, necessary to accomplish
- 18 the purposes of this section.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 12.057(b), Natural Resources Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (b) Not later than July 30, 2017 [2015], the commission
- 22 shall issue a final report to the governor, lieutenant governor,
- 23 speaker of the house of representatives, and appropriate committees
- 24 of the legislature.
- 25 SECTION 3. Section 12.058, Natural Resources Code, is
- 26 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 12.058. EXPIRATION OF SUBCHAPTER. This subchapter

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- 1 expires December 31, 2017 [2015].
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
