- (C) State Highway 361 between its intersection
- 19 with State Highway 35 and its intersection with Farm-to-Market Road
- 20 1069 (Main Street) in the city of Ingleside; and
- (D) proposed State Highway 200 between its

- 23 Farm-to-Market Road 1069 (Main Street) in the city of Ingleside, if

- 16 transported in San Patricio and Nueces Counties only over the roads
- 17 described by or designated under Section 623.303 [to and from the

- 19 state highway special freight corridor in San Patricio County]; and
- 20 (7) the location where the cargo was loaded.
- 21 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
