| 14 | (5) [(4)] is of sound mind and good moral character; |
| 15 | (6) (5) is able to read and write; |
| 16 | (7) [(6)] has not served as a petit juror for six days |
| 17 | during the preceding three months in the county court or during the |
| 18 | preceding six months in the district court; |
| 19 | (8) [(7)] has not been convicted of misdemeanor theft |
| 20 | or a felony; and |
| 21 | (9) [(8)] is not under indictment or other legal |
| 22 | accusation for misdemeanor theft or a felony. |
