3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
5	amended by adding Section 38.021 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 38.021. USE OF SUNSCREEN PRODUCTS. (a) A student may
7	possess and use a topical sunscreen product while on school
8	property or at a school-related event or activity to avoid
9	overexposure to the sun and not for the medical treatment of an
10	injury or illness if the product is approved by the federal Food and
11	Drug Administration for over-the-counter use.
12	(b) This section does not:
13	(1) waive any immunity from liability of a school
14	district, its board of trustees, or its employees; or
15	(2) create any liability for or a cause of action
16	against a school district, its board of trustees, or its employees.
17	SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
18	school year.
19	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
20	a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
21	provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
22	Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
