5 (b) The department shall enter an applicant's social 6 security number in the department's electronic database but may not 7 print the number on the applicant's driver's license <u>or personal</u> 8 <u>identification certificate</u>.

9 (e) The department shall include in the department's 10 legislative appropriations requests and budgets, in quarterly 11 performance reports, and in audits of the department's local 12 offices performance measures on the percentage of complete and 13 correct social security numbers on driver's licenses <u>and personal</u> 14 identification certificates.

(b) Not later than September 1, 2016, the department shall 10 submit a detailed report of its findings and recommendations to the 11 12 legislature. 13 (c) This section expires January 1, 2017. SECTION 7. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 14 a driver's license or personal identification certificate for which 15 an application is submitted on or after the effective date of this 16 Act. A driver's license or personal identification certificate for 17 which an application was submitted before the effective date of 18 this Act is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 19 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 20 that purpose. 21 To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails 22 SECTION 8. over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, 23 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 24 25 codes.

IN RE: SB1934 by Campbell (Relating to requirements for the issuance of a driver's license or personal identification certificate.), **As Passed 2nd House**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Transportation Code to stipulate how the Department of Public Safety (DPS) may request and use a driver license applicant's social security number, and would apply the same standards to personal identification cards. The bill would require an individual to surrender their identification card to get a driver license, and their driver license to get an identification card.

The bill would also amend the Government Code to require DPS to conduct a study on the feasibility of allowing a digitally displayed driver's license as proof of possessing a valid driver's license.

It is assumed implementing the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
