AN ACT

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. Section 1802.001, Occupations Code, is amended
7 by amending Subdivisions (1), (5), and (10) and adding Subdivision
8 (2) to read as follows:

9 (1) "Advisory board" means the Auctioneer [~~Education~~]
10 Advisory Board.

11 (2) "Associate auctioneer" means an individual who,
12 for compensation, is employed by and under the direct supervision
13 of a licensed auctioneer to sell or offer to sell property at an
14 auction.

15 (5) "Auctioneer" means any individual [~~person~~] who [+
16 [~~(A)~~] sells or offers to sell property of another
17 person by live bid at auction, with or without receiving
18 consideration[~~, or~~

19 [~~(B) solicits, negotiates, or executes an~~
20 ~~auction listing contract~~].

21 (10) "Personal property" means any property other than
22 real property[~~, including all tangible and intangible types of~~
23 ~~property~~].

24 SECTION 2. Section 1802.002(a), Occupations Code, is

1 amended to read as follows:

2 (a) This chapter does not apply to:

3 (1) a sale conducted by order of a United States court
4 under Title 11, United States Code;

5 (2) a sale conducted by an employee of the United
6 States, this state, or a political subdivision of this state in the
7 course and scope of employment;

8 (3) a sale conducted by a charitable, religious, or
9 civic organization, including an organization having a tax exempt
10 status under Section 501(c), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or
11 organized as a nonprofit entity, if the person organizing,
12 arranging, or conducting the auction receives no compensation;

13 ~~(4) [a sale conducted by any person of the person's~~
14 ~~property if the person is not engaged in the business of selling~~
15 ~~property at auction on a recurring basis,~~

16 [~~4~~5] a foreclosure sale of real property personally
17 conducted by a trustee under a deed of trust;

18 (5) [~~6~~] a foreclosure sale of personal property
19 personally conducted by:

20 (A) a person who holds a security interest in the
21 property, including a mortgage; or

22 (B) an employee or agent of a person described by
23 Paragraph (A) acting in the course and scope of employment, if:

24 (i) the employee or agent is not otherwise
25 engaged in the auction business; and

26 (ii) all property for sale in the auction is
27 subject to a security agreement;

1 (6) [~~(7)~~] a sale conducted by sealed bid without the
2 option of increasing or decreasing the amount of a bid;

3 (7) [~~(8)~~] an auction conducted only for student
4 training purposes as part of a course of study approved by the
5 department;

6 (8) [~~(9)~~] an auction conducted by a posted stockyard
7 or market agency as defined by the federal Packers and Stockyards
8 Act (7 U.S.C. Section 181 et seq.), as amended;

9 (9) [~~(10)~~] an auction of livestock conducted by a
10 nonprofit livestock trade association chartered in this state, if
11 the auction involves only the sale of livestock owned by members of
12 the trade association;

13 (10) [~~(11)~~] an auction conducted by a charitable or
14 nonprofit organization chartered in this state, if the auction:

15 (A) is part of a fair that is organized under
16 state, county, or municipal authority; and

17 (B) involves only the sale of property owned by
18 the organization's members; [~~or~~]

19 (11) [~~(12)~~] a sale or auction conducted by an
20 auctioneer while the auctioneer is physically located outside of
21 this state;

22 (12) a sale of motor vehicles at auction by a person
23 licensed under Chapter 2301 or 2302;

24 (13) a sale of motor vehicles at auction by a person
25 who holds a wholesale motor vehicle auction general distinguishing
26 number or an independent motor vehicle general distinguishing
27 number issued by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles; or

1 (14) an auction of property through the Internet.

2 SECTION 3. Subchapter A, Chapter 1802, Occupations Code, is
3 amended by adding Section 1802.004 to read as follows:

4 Sec. 1802.004. ADVERTISEMENT OF AUCTION. The commission,
5 by rule, may adopt standards for the advertisement of an auction by
6 an auctioneer or associate auctioneer licensed under this chapter.

7 SECTION 4. Section 1802.051, Occupations Code, is amended
8 by amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsection (d) to
9 read as follows:

10 (a) A person may not act as an auctioneer or associate
11 auctioneer [~~of real or personal property~~] in this state unless the
12 person holds a license issued by the executive director under this
13 chapter.

14 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an [~~An~~] individual
15 who is licensed under this chapter may not act as an auctioneer for
16 an entity unless the entity:

17 (1) is an auction company owned or operated by an
18 individual who is licensed under this chapter; or

19 (2) [~~holds a dealer general distinguishing number~~
20 ~~issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 503, Transportation Code, and~~
21 ~~the auction is for the purpose of auctioning vehicles as defined by~~
22 ~~Section 503.001, Transportation Code, or~~

23 [~~(3)~~] is a real estate brokerage firm that is operated
24 by a broker licensed by the Texas Real Estate Commission.

25 (d) An individual who is licensed under this chapter may
26 conduct an auction to sell motor vehicles, as defined by Section
27 501.002 or 502.001, Transportation Code, for a person who holds:

1 (1) a dealer general distinguishing number or a
2 wholesale motor vehicle auction general distinguishing number
3 issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 503, Transportation Code; or

4 (2) a license issued under Subchapter C, Chapter 2302.

5 SECTION 5. Section 1802.052(a), Occupations Code, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) An individual is eligible for an auctioneer's license if
8 the individual:

9 (1) is at least 18 years of age;

10 (2) is a citizen of the United States or a legal alien;

11 (3) either:

12 (A) passes a written or oral examination
13 demonstrating knowledge of the auction business and of the laws of
14 this state relating to the auction business; or

15 (B) shows proof of employment by a licensed
16 auctioneer for at least two years and participation in at least 10
17 auctions during that employment;

18 (4) holds a high school diploma or a high school
19 equivalency certificate;

20 (5) has not been convicted of a felony during the five
21 years preceding the date of application; and

22 (6) has completed at least 80 hours of classroom
23 instruction at an auction school with a curriculum approved by the
24 department in accordance with the standards and procedures
25 established by rule adopted under this chapter.

26 SECTION 6. Subchapter B, Chapter 1802, Occupations Code, is
27 amended by adding Section 1802.053 to read as follows:

1 Sec. 1802.053. ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSOCIATE AUCTIONEER
2 LICENSE. An individual is eligible for an associate auctioneer
3 license if the individual is:

4 (1) a citizen of the United States or a legal alien;
5 and

6 (2) employed under the direct supervision of an
7 auctioneer licensed under this chapter.

8 SECTION 7. Section 1802.054, Occupations Code, is amended
9 to read as follows:

10 Sec. 1802.054. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE. An applicant for a
11 license must apply to the executive director on a form provided by
12 the executive director that establishes the applicant's
13 eligibility for the license. The application must be accompanied
14 by:

15 (1) any fee required for the auctioneer education and
16 recovery fund authorized under Section 1802.153;

17 (2) the required application [~~license~~] fee; and

18 (3) either:

19 (A) the permit number of a sales tax permit
20 issued to the applicant by the comptroller under Subchapter F,
21 Chapter 151, Tax Code; or

22 (B) proof of exemption from the tax permit
23 requirement under Chapter 151, Tax Code.

24 SECTION 8. Section 1802.055, Occupations Code, is amended
25 to read as follows:

26 Sec. 1802.055. APPLICATION FOR EXAMINATION. [~~a~~] An
27 individual who establishes that the individual is eligible for an

1 auctioneer's license may apply to the executive director to take
2 the license examination. The application must be accompanied by
3 the application ~~[examination]~~ fee.

4 ~~[(b) On receipt of an examination application and fee, the~~
5 ~~executive director shall furnish the applicant with:~~

6 ~~[(1) study materials and references on which the~~
7 ~~examination will be based, and~~

8 ~~[(2) a schedule specifying the dates and places the~~
9 ~~examination will be offered.~~

10 ~~[(c) The applicant may take the examination at any scheduled~~
11 ~~offering not later than the 90th day after the date the applicant~~
12 ~~receives the study materials.]~~

13 SECTION 9. Section 1802.059(b), Occupations Code, is
14 amended to read as follows:

15 (b) The executive director shall accept the applicant's
16 auctioneer's license submitted under Subsection (a)(2) as proof of
17 the applicant's professional competence and waive the examination
18 or employment and training requirements of Section 1802.052 if the
19 state or political subdivision that issued the nonresident a
20 license extends similar recognition and courtesies to this state.

21 SECTION 10. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 1802,
22 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

23 SUBCHAPTER C. AUCTIONEER ~~[EDUCATION]~~ ADVISORY BOARD

24 SECTION 11. The heading to Section 1802.101, Occupations
25 Code, is amended to read as follows:

26 Sec. 1802.101. AUCTIONEER ~~[EDUCATION]~~ ADVISORY BOARD.

27 SECTION 12. Section 1802.106, Occupations Code, is amended

2 Sec. 1802.106. COMPENSATION. A member appointed under
3 Section 1802.102(a)(1) may not receive[+

4 [~~(1)~~] compensation for serving on the advisory board[+

5 ~~or~~

6 [~~(2)~~ reimbursement for expenses].

7 SECTION 13. Section 1802.107, Occupations Code, is amended
8 to read as follows:

9 Sec. 1802.107. MEETINGS. [~~(a)~~ The advisory board shall
10 ~~meet at least quarterly each calendar year.~~

11 [~~(b)~~] The advisory board shall [~~may~~] meet [~~at other times~~]
12 at the call of the presiding officer of the commission or the
13 executive director.

14 SECTION 14. Section 2301.362, Occupations Code, is amended
15 by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsections (c) and (d) to
16 read as follows:

17 (a) Except as provided by Subsections [~~Subsection~~] (b) and
18 (c) and Sections 2301.358(c) and (d), a dealer may only sell or
19 offer to sell a motor vehicle from an established and permanent
20 place of business:

21 (1) that is approved by the division; and

22 (2) for which a general distinguishing number has been
23 issued.

24 (c) A dealer may sell, offer to sell, including by
25 consignment, or exchange at a public auction an antique motor
26 vehicle that is at least 25 years of age or a special interest
27 vehicle that is at least 12 years of age or that has been the subject

1 of a retail sale.

2 (d) For purposes of this section, "special interest
3 vehicle" has the meaning assigned by Section 683.077,
4 Transportation Code.


5 SECTION 15. Sections 1802.001(12) and 1802.051(b),
6 Occupations Code, are repealed.

7 SECTION 16. Not later than March 1, 2016, the Texas
8 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary
9 to implement the changes in law made by this Act.


10 SECTION 17. (a) Notwithstanding Chapter 1802, Occupations
11 Code, as amended by this Act, a person is not required to hold a
12 license issued under that chapter to act as an associate auctioneer
13 until March 1, 2016.

14 (b) An individual who was licensed by the Texas Department
15 of Licensing and Regulation as an associate auctioneer on or before
16 June 14, 2013, may apply the individual's work experience
17 participating in auctions as an associate auctioneer on or before
18 June 14, 2013, toward the individual's eligibility for an
19 auctioneer's license under Chapter 1802, Occupations Code.

20 SECTION 18. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.






