21 WHEREAS, The world's other major developed nations allow 22 crude oil exports, making America the only nation that does not take 23 full advantage of trading a valuable resource in what is an 24 otherwise global free market; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Crude oil exports will benefit America's national
- 2 security interests by decreasing the likelihood that global oil
- 3 supply can be used internationally as a strategic weapon; and
- WHEREAS, Numerous studies have found that allowing American
- 5 crude oil into the world's free market will benefit United States
- 6 trade and American consumers while creating more high-paying jobs
- 7 for Texans to fill; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to an analysis by the American Petroleum
- 9 Institute, Texas will lead all states in job growth following the
- 10 repeal of the ban, with an estimated 40,291 jobs by 2020; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Other studies have similarly found tremendous
- 12 prospective GDP growth from lifting the 1970s-era ban; and
- WHEREAS, The United States is the largest exporter of refined
- 14 petroleum products and would benefit even more substantially from
- 15 the export of both crude oil and refined petroleum products; and
- WHEREAS, At least seven independent studies have confirmed
- 17 that repealing the ban on American crude oil exports will lower gas
- 18 prices in the United States, benefiting Texas consumers and
- 19 businesses; and
- WHEREAS, Thousands of small and large Texas businesses that
- 21 support oil and gas development will benefit from ongoing
- 22 production; and
- WHEREAS, Manufacturers will benefit from less volatility in
- 24 energy costs; and
- WHEREAS, The technology and brainpower behind the American
- 26 energy renaissance was mostly pioneered in Texas by Texans; and
- WHEREAS, Encouraging a global marketplace that is more free

- 1 from artificial barriers will better allow the export of Texas
- 2 leadership and expertise, which will also ultimately economically
- 3 benefit Texas, the rest of the United States, and our friends around
- 4 the world; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the 84th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 6 hereby urge the United States Congress and the president of the
- 7 United States to recognize that crude oil exports and free trade are
- 8 in the national interest and take all necessary steps to eliminate
- 9 the current ban on crude oil exports; and, be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 11 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
- 12 the United States secretary of commerce, to the United States
- 13 secretary of energy, to the majority leader of the Senate and the
- 14 speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States
- 15 Congress, and to all the members of the Texas delegation to Congress
- 16 with the request that this resolution be entered in the
- 17 Congressional Record as a memorial to the Congress of the United
- 18 States of America.
