William J. McNeill: [00:00:17] Mrs. JOHNSON I think that one of the very important things to note and I definitely want this on the tape is that your influence with the young kids you work with, I believe, must have been very large. As evidence of this, in 1958 of the graduating senior girls at Robert E. Lee high school 20 percent, 20% of the graduating girls went into nursing. This is William J.
