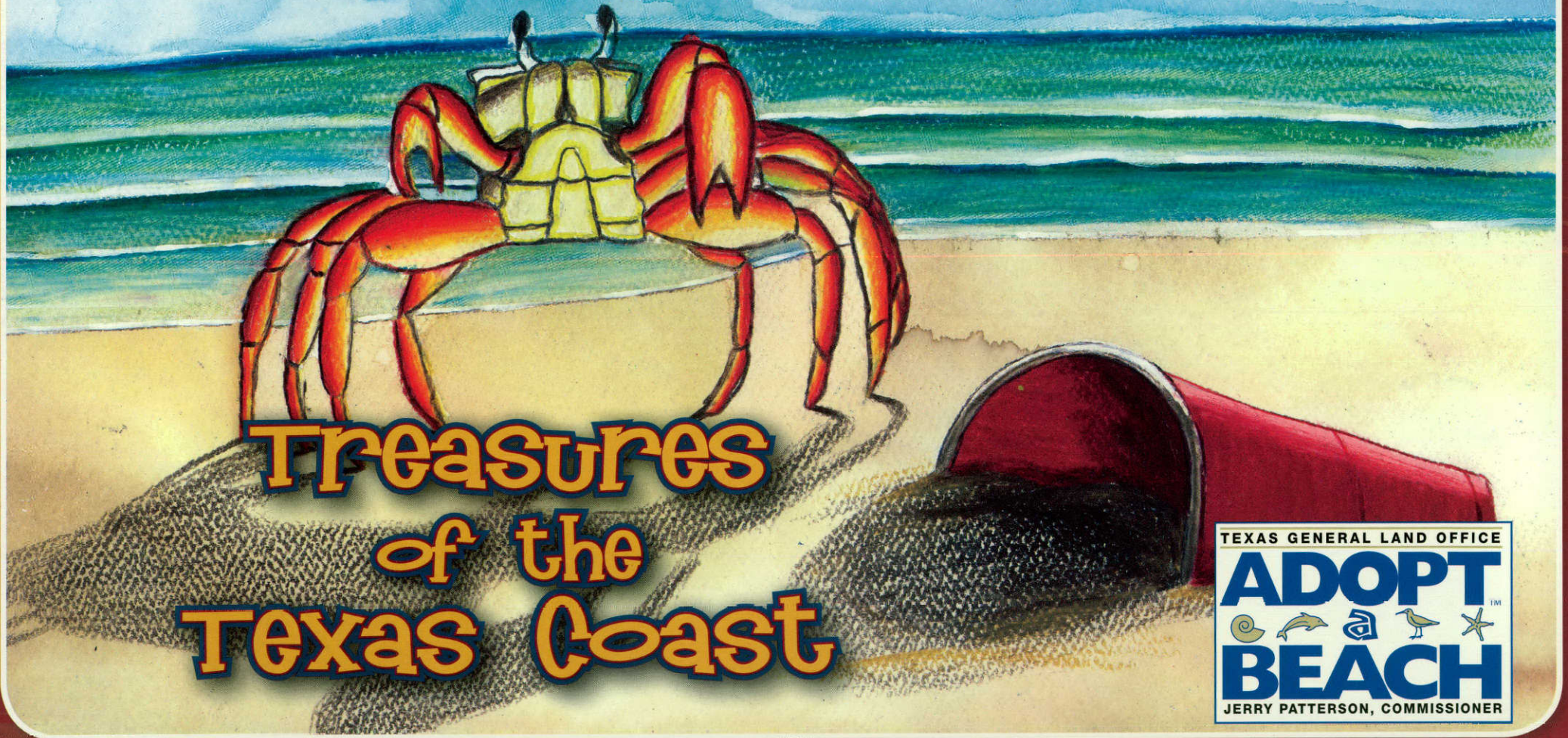

2011 Calendar

The Texas General Land Office (GLO) is pleased to present this calendar featuring the 40 winning entries in the Adopt-A-Beach program's "Treasures of the Texas Coast" Children's Art Contest. The annual contest is open to students in grades K through 6. Last year, more than 5,600 students from across the state submitted artwork illustrating what they value about the Texas coast. The calendar also contains facts about the Texas coast.

Texas Adopt-A-Beach Program

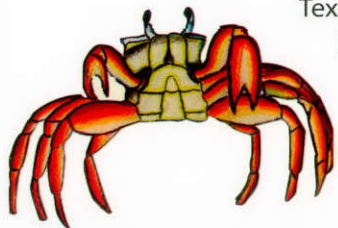
The Texas Adopt-A-Beach program is an all-volunteer effort to remove trash from Texas beaches and to increase public awareness of the problems of marine debris and beach litter. Twice each year, volunteers check in at sites along the coast to pick up trash. Since the first cleanup in 1986, more than 406,000 volunteers have removed 7,800 tons of trash from Texas beaches.



The Texas Adopt-A-Beach program emphasizes the importance of education in preventing debris on Texas beaches. Years of data collection from beach cleanups have helped to identify many sources of this debris which can be categorized into two major groups: land-based sources and ocean-based sources.

According to the Ocean Conservancy, land-based sources contribute 70 percent of all trash found in the ocean. The largest source is trash washed off streets into storm drains that empty directly into streams, rivers and bays. Each time it rains, runoff from the street picks up litter and other pollutants.

Commercial fishing vessels, recreational boats, cargo vessels, and offshore petroleum rigs are just some of the ocean-based sources of marine debris. The various plastic wastes from these sources are among the most pervasive and threatening forms of debris found in our oceans.

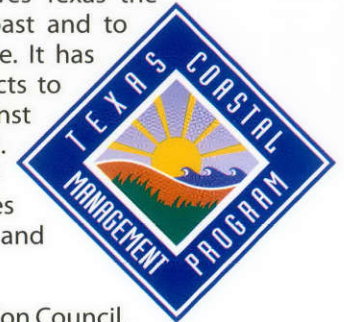


While the Adopt-A-Beach program is primarily funded by the Texas General Land Office, a key factor in the success of the program is support from the private sector. Texas Coastal Management Program

The Texas Coastal Management Program (CMP) gives Texas the ability to coordinate coastal activities along the coast and to have a say in federal decisions that impact the state. It has enabled communities to plan and implement projects to revitalize coastal waterfronts, protect themselves against coastal hazards and rebuild or enhance natural areas. Each year, the CMP funds numerous coastal projects through a competitive grants process and undertakes a variety of coastal initiatives aimed at protecting and enhancing 16 coastal natural resource areas.



The program is administered by the Coastal Coordination Council, composed of the heads of seven state natural resource agencies, the director of the Texas Sea Grant College Program, and four members appointed by the governor to represent agriculture, local government, coastal businesses, and coastal residents.

CONTEST GUIDELINES

Entry Deadline: Tuesday, March 1, 2011

1. Student artwork must be original and on a plain sheet of **white 8 1/2" x 11" paper** and can be in any medium **except computer generated. Three-dimensional artwork or artwork displaying logos, product brands or store names is ineligible.** Artwork should be **based on the theme "Treasures of the Texas Coast"** and should depict why the Texas coast is special to the student. Each student may submit only one entry **which should incorporate the official Adopt-A-Beach slogan "Trashing Texas Beaches Isn't Cool."**TM
2. All entries must have the parental release form **taped** to the back.
3. Ten winners will be chosen from each of the following categories for awards: Grades K, 1 and 2; Grades 3 and 4; Grade 5; and Grade 6. From these 40 winners, one grand prize winner will be chosen. Results will be announced in early spring and the winning works of art will appear together on a calendar which will be distributed throughout the state. Winners will be determined by a panel of judges. Judging will be based on originality, creativity and consistency with the theme "Treasures of the Texas Coast" and usage of the slogan "Trashing Texas Beaches Isn't Cool."TM
4. Damaged, late or previously entered drawings are not eligible. The GLO's determination regarding lost, damaged, late or previous entries will be final.
5. All drawings become the property of the GLO. Winners and their parents/guardians agree to the GLO's use of their drawings and names to promote the Adopt-A-Beach program. Artist credit will be given.
6. Since **entries will not be returned, you may want to color copy the drawing prior to mailing it to the GLO.**
7. Household family members of GLO employees are not eligible.
8. All entries must be postmarked by Tuesday, March 1, 2011.
9. This contest is void where prohibited.
10. All taxes on prizes are the sole responsibility of the prize winner.
