#### PURPOSE OF THE OFFICE OF CAPITAL AND FORENSIC WRITS

The Office of Capital Writs was established by the 81st Legislative Session to provide representation to capital defendants in post-conviction proceedings. Senate Bill 1743 of the 84th Legislative Session expanded the mandate of the Office of Capital Writs to include the representation of some defendants in post-conviction litigation of forensic science issues. To reflect the expanded mandated, the agency's name was changed to Office of Capital and Forensic Writs (OCFW).

#### OVERVIEW OF THE OCFW'S FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION REQUEST

The OCFW represents a large majority of death-sentenced persons in initial state post-conviction proceedings and related proceedings through appointments made by the trial court; the agency is currently litigating 53 pending cases on behalf of 40 clients.

Following appointment, consistent with statutory and professional requirements, OCFW must conduct a thorough and independent investigation of both the conviction and the sentence, raising every available legal claim regarding the constitutionality of a particular client's conviction and/or sentence. Professional guidelines dictate that post-conviction counsel cannot rely on the previously complied record or limit the scope of post-conviction investigation to what was done previously; instead, post-conviction counsel must conduct a thorough and independent investigation, treating the writ of habeas corpus as both the first and last meaningful opportunity to present new evidence to challenge a client's conviction and sentence. See State Bar of Texas, Guidelines and Standards for Texas Capital Counsel (2006); State Bar of Texas, Supplementary Guidelines and Standards for the Mitigation Function of Defense Teams in Texas Death Penalty Cases (2015).

Once an application for post-conviction relief is filed and the prosecution responds, a district court is supposed to determine whether controverted issues of fact exist that are material to the claims raised regarding the constitutionality of the conviction or sentence and then may hold a hearing where evidence will be presented. Whether a hearing is granted is up to the district court and is supposed to be based on an analysis of the claims in a particular habeas application. Therefore, it is difficult to predict whether and when hearings will be granted. Once a district court considers the merits of a habeas application, the court will issue recommended findings of fact and conclusions of law and send the case to the Court of Criminal Appeals (CCA). After a case is sent to the CCA, the OCFW will brief issues raised by the district court's disposition, and the CCA will grant relief, remand the case to the district court for further proceedings, or deny relief. Thus, in the course of representing clients, the OCFW litigates cases both at the district-court level in the counties of conviction and before the CCA.

With the passage of SB 1743, the mandate of the OCFW also includes representing convicted persons in post-conviction litigation brought under Article 11.073 of the Code of Criminal Procedure or that is collateral to the preparation of an application under Article 11.073, if the case was referred in writing to the OCFW by the Texas Forensic Science Commission (FSC) under Article 38.01 §4(h). See Tex. Govt. Code § 78.054(b)(4). Such referrals may include an investigation into professional misconduct or negligence affecting the forensic analysis.

Upon receiving a referral from the FSC, the OCFW determines whether the subject of the case referral is represented by counsel. If the individual is represented by counsel, OCFW consults with counsel to: 1) identify the forensic science issue to appointed private counsel; and 2) offer litigation support. The latter may include researching and modeling pleadings for the counsel assigned to investigate the basis of a post-conviction writ challenging the reliance on discredited forensic evidence. In this capacity, the OCFW serves as a resource to members of the private criminal defense bar who are also interested in litigating these issues.

If, upon receiving a referral from the FSC, the OCFW determines that individuals with a compelling issue of forensic science in their case are without counsel, or if counsel is unable or unwilling to represent their clients in state post-conviction proceedings, the OCFW determines whether it can represent these individuals. In reviewing cases for forensic science-related issues, the OCFW may consult with law school clinics and experts in the field.

#### EXCEPTIONAL ITEM #1: RESTORATION OF THE 4% REDUCTION

#### Description/Justification:

The OCFW respectfully requests restoration of the 4% reduction in funding because the reduction will transfer more of the costs of post-conviction representation to Texas counties. The OCFW is professionally and statutorily obligated to investigate all possible constitutional claims relating to conviction and sentence. Often these claims turn on questions of ballistics, forensic evidence, scientific evidence, and issues relating to a client's cognition, competence, and mental illness—areas beyond the ken of the legal profession. Thus, to investigate these claims, the OCFW must consult with experts in different scientific and academic disciplines, and base any claim subsequently raised on the opinions of these experts. Such experts are indispensable to post-conviction representation; they are required by the Guidelines and Standards for Texas Capital Counsel issued by the State Bar of Texas, and are contemplated by statute that outlines the OCFW's basic directives. See, e.g., Article 11.071(3).

Without the restoration of the 4% reduction, the OCFW will be forced to rely on funding from local district courts for the appointment of appropriate experts that would otherwise be funded through legislative appropriation.

#### External/Internal Factors:

Texas counties are already struggling to fund indigent defense costs, and the shifting of additional costs of post-conviction representation to the counties will additionally burden county-level court and indigent defense budgets that are stretched for resources.

#### EXCEPTIONAL ITEM #2: ADDITIONAL STAFF TO FULFILL MANDATE

#### Description/Justification:

In the 84th Legislative Session, SB 1743 expanded the OCFW's powers and duties beyond post-conviction matters in death penalty cases to include habeas corpus and other post-conviction matters in cases involving certain forensic scientific evidence that becomes available after conviction. SB 1743, however, did not appropriate corresponding funding to account for the expanded mandate; rather, it provided the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill, by including a fiscal note that anticipated that the OCFW's staff would expand by two attorneys in fiscal year 2018, and an additional attorney in fiscal year 2019, to manage the additional forensic science cases.

The OCFW requests the addition of two investigators to ensure that it can keep pace with the rate of referrals. The most significant current limiting factor on the number of cases the OCFW handles is investigation; because of our presently overtaxed investigation resources, we have a backlog of newer cases that can wait for 12 months after assignment before investigation is able to begin in any meaningful way. When cases are not investigated promptly and thoroughly at the state level, it increases the likelihood that the cases will be subject to additional scrutiny by federal courts, depriving the state courts of their ability to control the course of litigation and decide, in the first instance, important constitutional issues. The delay and strained resources also increases the likelihood that key witnesses and documentary evidence will become more difficult and costly to find.

The OCFW requests professional fees and services and travel appropriations to allow for the investigation of potential constitutional and junk science claims and for consultations with experts commensurate with the expanded mandate.

In addition, the OCFW requests an Accountant I to help manage accounting and reporting obligations. The OCFW currently has a single staff person with the responsibility over finance, accounting, payroll, human resources, reporting, travel and reimbursement. When the OCFW was smaller, it was at least possible for one staff person to accomplish so many different, complicated, and vitally important institutional areas. Given the present and anticipated size of the agency, the expectation that a single person can handle this administrative workload is unrealistic. Therefore, the OCFW respectfully requests an additional Accountant I.

#### External/Internal Factors:

Without the requested money, the OCFW will be unable to fill the need recognized by SB 1743 for an institutional provider of post-conviction representation and resources in connection with challenges to convictions that relied on questionable forensic science.

Furthermore, without the additional investigative resources, the OCFW will be unable to provide the competent representation to its clients that is professionally required and statutorily mandated. When cases are not investigated promptly and thoroughly at the state level, it increases the likelihood that the cases will be subject to additional scrutiny by federal courts, depriving the state courts of their ability to control the course of litigation and decide, in the first instance, important constitutional issues.

Lastly, the OCFW requests an appropriation to pay for certain information technology and equipment costs associated with additional staff.

Although the OCFW's is currently using all of its available space, it is not requesting money for additional space to accommodate new staff, but will instead work with the Texas Facilities Commission to find a location for staff at no additional cost to the State.

### CONCLUSION


Individuals sentenced to death have a right to competent post-conviction representation. The State of Texas has an important interest in ensuring both that individuals are not executed in violation of the Constitution or with their guilt in doubt, and that the litigation of any claims regarding their conviction or sentence occur first and foremost in Texas courts. Likewise, as the 84th Legislature recognized, there is need for attorneys to represent individuals convicted on the basis of questionable forensic science and for the OCFW to serve as a resource to members of the bar who are handling these cases. To fulfill its mandate of providing competent, much-needed post-conviction representation, the OCFW respectfully asks for consideration of the following legislative appropriations request.

Under this Strategy, the Office of Capital and Forensic Writs ("OCFW") provides post-conviction representation to death-sentenced individuals convicted of capital crimes in Texas, and persons convicted on the basis of suspect forensic science.

The OCFW represents a large majority of death-sentenced persons in initial state post-conviction proceedings, and related proceedings, through appointments made by the trial court. Following appointment, consistent with statutory and professional requirements, OCFW must conduct a thorough and independent investigation of both the conviction and the sentence, raising every available legal claim regarding the constitutionality of a particular client's conviction or sentence.

With the passage of SB 1743, the mandate of the OCFW also includes the representation of convicted persons non-capital cases in post-conviction litigation brought under Article 11.073 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, or that is collateral to the preparation of an application under Article 11.073, if the case was referred in writing to the OCFW by the Texas Forensic Science Commission (FSC) under Article 38.01 §4(h). See Tex. Govt. Code § 78.054(b)(4). Such referrals may include an investigation into professional misconduct or negligence affecting the forensic analysis.

The Texas Code of Criminal Procedure guarantees capital habeas applicants the right to competent representation. Over the last several years, the United States Supreme Court has dramatically expanded the ability of federal courts to decide claims that were raised incorrectly or not raised at all in state courts. See, e.g., Trevino v. Thaler, 133 S.Ct. 1911 (2013). Thus, in the event that the OCFW is not appropriated sufficient money to allow for the full and fair investigation and litigation of constitutional claims in Texas courts, federal courts may decide important constitutional questions relative to the confinement of Texas prisoners instead of Texas courts.

The number of new death sentences can be expected to fluctuate from year to year, and depends on prosecutorial charging decisions and juror verdicts out of the OCFW's control.

There are approximately 244 individuals on death row in Texas. Most have lawyers to raise available constitutional claims; some do not. The OCFW receives requests periodically from the trial courts to represent death sentenced individuals where the prior lawyer was unable or unwilling to continue representation. The number of cases referred to the OCFW is this way is difficult to predict but likely small in number.

With the expansion of the mandate of the OCFW into cases of new or changed forensic science, the number of referrals to the OCFW can be expected to fluctuate greatly, depending on the state of particular forensic science disciplines over time and the level of scientific scrutiny directed at these disciplines.

# Description/Justification for continuation of existing riders or proposed new rider

Any unexpended balances appropriated in fiscal year 2018 are hereby appropriated to the Office of Capital and Forensic Writs for fiscal year 2019 for the same purposes.

Investigation costs are a major component of the OCFW's budget. Uncertainty exists with respect to these costs because they vary based on the particulars of the case being filed, and whether a district court holds an evidentiary hearing requiring the live testimony of lay and expert witnesses. In addition, payments for outside experts may not be hilled in the year services begin. Authority to carry forward unexpended balances between years of the biennium provides greater flexibility in managing expenses that may vary greatly from year to year.

Unexpended balances authority was given to the OCFW by the 82nd, 83rd, and 84th Legislatures, R.S. The OCFW requests unexpended budget authority again in FY 2018-19.

#### DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

The OCFW respectfully requests restoration of the 4% reduction in funding because the reduction will transfer more of the costs of post-conviction representation to Texas counties. The OCFW is professionally and statutorily obligated to investigate all possible constitutional claims relating to conviction and sentence. Often these claims turn on questions of ballistics, forensic evidence, scientific evidence, and issues relating to a client's cognition, competence and mental illness. Thus, to investigate these claims, the OCFW must consult with experts in different scientific and academic disciplines, and base subsequent claims on expert opinion. Such experts are indispensable to post-conviction representation; they are required by the Guidelines and Standards for Texas Capital Counsel issued by the State Bar of Texas, and are contemplated by statute, See, e.g. Article 11.071(3).

Without the restoration of the 4% reduction, the OCFW will be forced to rely on funding from local district courts for the appointment of experts that would otherwise be funded through legislative appropriation.

#### **EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:**

Texas counties are already struggling to fund indigent defense costs, and the shifting of additional costs of post-conviction representation to the counties will additionally burden county-level court and indigent defense budgets that are stretched for resources.

#### DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

SB 1742 expanded the mandate of the OCFW, but did not appropriate funding for the expansion. Its fiscal note anticipated that the staff of OCFW would need to be expanded by two attorneys in fiscal year 2018, and an additional attorney in fiscal year 2019 to manage the additional forensic science cases. These attorneys are requested in this exception item.

The OCFW requests the addition of two investigators to ensure that it can keep pace with the rate of referrals. The most significant current limiting factor on the number of cases the OCFW handles is investigation; because of our presently overtaxed investigation resources, we have a backlog of newer cases that can wait for 12 months after assignment before investigation is able to begin in any meaningful way.

The OCFW requests professional fees and services and travel appropriations to allow for the investigation of potential constitutional and forensic science claims, and consultation with appropriate experts, commensurate with the expanded mandate.

In addition, the OCFW requests the addition of an Accountant I to help manage finance, procurement, payroll, and reporting obligations. The OCFW currently has a single staff person with the responsibility over these complicated and vitally important institutional areas. As such, the OCFW respectfully requests the addition of an Accountant 1 to help meet the administrative needs of the agency.

#### EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:

Without the requested money, the OCFW will be unable to fill the need recognized by SB 1743 for an institutional provider of post-conviction representation and resources in connection with challenges to convictions that relied on junk science. Furthermore, without the additional investigative resources, the OCFW will be unable to provide the competent representation to its clients that is professionally required and statutorily mandated. When cases are not investigated promptly and thoroughly at the state level, it increases the likelihood that the cases will be subject to additional scrutiny by federal courts, depriving the state courts of their ability to control the course of litigation and decide, in the first instance, important constitutional issues. Lastly, the OCFW requests an appropriation to pay for certain information technology and equipment costs associated with additional staff.

Item Comment: A 10% reduction to the Office of Capital and Forensic Writs would require a reduction of at least two staff over the biennium. This would adversely affect the clients and cases currently handled by the OCFW, resulting in less consistent and competent investigation and litigation of these cases. In addition, the OCFW would be forced to turn down new assignments until its present caseload was reduced through attrition to a level commensurate with staffing. It also be difficult for the OCFW to expand its reach to cases challenging junk science. This would adversely affect the clients and cases currently handled by the OCFW, resulting in less consistent and competent investigation and litigation of these cases. In addition, the OCFW would be forced to turn down new assignments until its present caseload was reduced through attrition to a level commensurate with staffing. It also be difficult for the OCFW to expand its reach to cases challenging junk science. Thus, a 10% reduction would defeat the legislative purpose behind the creation of the OCFW, and result in more costs being borne by the counties.
